Emergency Alerts test in September

On Sunday 7 September at 3pm, the UK government will test the Emergency Alerts system.

This system sends a warning via all compatible 4G and 5G mobiles or tablets if there's a life-threatening emergency nearby.

During the test, a loud siren-like sound, vibration, and a message will appear on the screen. The sound and vibration will last for about 10 seconds. No action is required.

Advice for victims of domestic abuse

Victims of abuse may have a phone hidden from their abuser – if you're able and it's safe to do so, please make any victims of abuse aware of the Emergency Alerts test. Alerts can be disabled through the device's settings menu:

For iPhones and Android phones To opt out:

- Search your settings for 'emergency alerts'.
- Turn off 'severe alerts' and 'extreme alerts'.
- alerts', then 'alert'
- 'settings', then 'sounds', then 'advanced', then 'emergency broadcasts'
- 'settings', then 'general settings', then 'emergency alerts'

Then turn off 'severe alerts', 'extreme alerts' and 'test alerts'.
